## **Walking Tour**

Together with The Rocks, Macquarie Street is Sydney's oldest area. While The Rocks developed as the place for the lower classes - the convicts and soldiers, Macquarie Street became the centre of the Governing, legal and medical professions very early in the history of the colony of New South Wales.

Students will learn about the development of the New South Wales colony through stories about important people in Government and in society who contributed greatly to the progress, development and growth of Sydney. They will visit significant heritage buildings in the Macquarie St area as we discuss the reasons they were built, the changing uses of these buildings over time and their present day conservation.

Explore this significant historical part of Sydney as you hear about how as Governor, Lachlan Macquarie transformed this settlement from a penal colony into what would become Australia.
